MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



We started 2022 with new expectations as the effects and ramifications of the pandemic began to ease worldwide; we all hoped and guessed to return to where things used to be.

We were wrong.

An extreme and utterly unexpected event shattered our plans: the war in Ukraine.

The escalating events triggered uncontrollable consequences and tension, and initially, we had to handle a situation we had not gained experience before.

I am genuinely thankful for all the organisations and individuals who donated to the FCI charity account and helped allocate finances to aid our fellow breeders in Ukraine.

The aftereffects of the pandemic and the consequences of the war added up and caused a drastically challenging situation. The whole world faces severe economic complications. This definitely causes and will cause various types of further difficulties worldwide in relation to dog breeding as well. You cannot establish an effective strategy in an unstable world economy.

Many of us are struggling to maintain our own “world” sustainable. The best is to adjust, no matter how uncertain the environment is, and do our very best to go forward, aiming for our future goals.

Under such circumstances, we finally had our General Assembly after three years in Madrid. We all got used to participating in online meetings from our living rooms, but needless to say, how meaningful personal interactions are. Face-to-face discussions are necessary, especially in a vast and diverse organisation like the FCI.

In April, we completed an important webinar organised by the FCI Youth. Youngsters are our future, and it is significant to engage and guide them at the same time. I am honestly sure this event gave true inspiration to all of us.

In November, another event took place with high significance: the very first FCI Health and Welfare Conference hosted by the Mexican Kennel Club was held. The three-day conference covered a broad spectrum of current dog welfare and health topics, presented by renowned experts from all around the globe.

I proudly admit that the event was a massive success with high attendance. The recordings of the presentations are available for everyone, and I honestly hope this was not the last conference where we could thoroughly cover and discuss these matters.

The conference was crucial for another reason: the anti-breeding campaigns and narrative have become more robust, especially in Europe. But have no doubt it is just a question of time before the mentality of blaming pedigree dogs for all issues crosses the continent’s border, triggering a threat to other parts of the world.

Education and communication play an inevitable part in answering these challenges. The FCI has already conducted such projects. For instance, we organised an online conference for each FCI section on how to handle anti-breeding propaganda. We introduced the ProActive educational project of Royal Canin. And in June 2023, we will finally organise another significant milestone, the BOAS conference and workshop that was postponed due to the pandemic. This event will give the toolkit with scientific background for the respective persons of the National Canine Organisations and their delegated veterinarians involved in brachycephalic breeds.

We have a lot on our tables during these unpredictable and uncertain times. For this, and for all the other difficulties we face on a daily basis, unity is more important than ever before. We face new challenges and destructive threats. It is evident that old methods do not apply anymore, and we jointly need to find the best and most effective practices to protect our beloved activity.

The year 2022 has made it clear.

INTRODUCTION

Established in 1911, the FCI includes 98 Members and Contract Partners (one member per country). Each Member issues their own pedigrees and train highly-qualified judges. The FCI makes sure that the pedigrees and judges are mutually recognised by all the FCI members, Contract Partners and any person involved in their domestic canine scene.

In accordance with the celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale, the FCI General Committee reviewed its Mission, Vision Statement and Values to maintain the Association's leadership worldwide. In 2018, further to the decision of the FCI Extraordinary General Assembly, FCI's Mission, Vision Statements and Values were revised as follows:

MISSION AND VISION STATEMENT

The FCI is the highest authority of the canine culture and supports, via its Members and Contract Partners, the well-being of pedigree dogs worldwide as well as their selective breeding and generational registrations.

The FCI is responsible for safeguarding pedigree dogs' health and international pedigree dog activities to enhance the relations between dogs and humans.

The FCI recognises that the following principles and professional responsibilities are fundamental for the well-being of all pedigree dogs worldwide:

VALUES

- a/ The FCI considers pedigree dogs' health, temperament and behaviour of utmost importance in Breed Standards.
- b/ The FCI promotes pedigree dogs' activities and sports worldwide, which it considers beneficial for the pedigree dogs.
- c/ The FCI entrusts its commissions to make recommendations about other important matters.
- d/ The FCI divides geographically the world of pedigree dogs through its three (3) sections.
- e/ The FCI trusts its Members and Contract Partners to protect the integrity of their National Registries.
- f/ The FCI recognises and respects agreements with non-member national organisations.
- g/ The FCI sets the highest standards for its Head Office.
- h/ The FCI ensures the regular celebration of World and Section Championship events.

- f/ La FCI respecte et reconnaît les accords qui ont été conclus avec des organisations nationales non-Membres.
- g/ La FCI établit des normes de la plus haute qualité pour son Siègne social.
- h/ La FCI veille à l'organisation régulière de championnats du monde et de section.

INTRODUCCIÓN

En el marco del 100^o aniversario de la Fédération Cynologique Internationale, el Comité General de la FCI revisó su Declaración de Misión y Visión, así como los Valores de la FCI, con el fin de mantener la posición de liderazgo mundial de la Asociación.

En 2018, a raíz de la decisión de la Asamblea General Extraordinaria de la FCI, la Declaración de Misión y Visión, y los Valores de la FCI han sido modificados :

La FCI reconoce que los principios a continuación y las responsabilidades profesionales son fundamentales para el bienestar de todos los perros con pedigrí del mundo :

VALORES

- a/ La FCI considera que la salud, el carácter y el comportamiento de los perros con pedigrí son temas de mayor importancia en los estándares de raza.
- b/ La FCI fomenta a nivel mundial aquellas actividades y disciplinas de deporte para los perros con pedigrí que considera beneficiosas para ellos.
- c/ La FCI encarga a sus comisiones ofrecer recomendaciones para otros temas importantes.
- d/ La FCI clasifica geográficamente el mundo de los perros con pedigrí conforme a sus tres (3) secciones.
- e/ La FCI confía en que sus Miembros y Socios contratantes mantengan la homogeneidad e integridad de sus registros nacionales.
- f/ La FCI respeta y acepta los acuerdos tomados con organizaciones nacionales de países que no son miembros.
- g/ La FCI es extremadamente exigente con su oficina central.
- h/ La FCI se encarga de las celebraciones periódicas de los Campeonatos Mundiales y de Sección.

EINLEITUNG

Die FCI wurde in 1911 gegründet und hat 98 Mitglieder und Vertragspartner (ein Mitglied pro Land). Jedes Mitglied erstellt seine eigenen Ahnentafeln und bildet hochqualifizierte Richter aus. Die FCI stellt sicher, dass die Ahnentafeln und Richter innerhalb der FCI von allen Mitgliedern, Vertragspartnern und allen in der Hundeszene tätigen Personen anerkannt werden.

Im Rahmen des 100-jährigen Jubiläums der Fédération Cynologique Internationale hat der FCI-Vorstand seine Mission-Statement und seine Vision-Statement sowie die Werte überarbeitet um die weltweite Führungsposition der Vereinigung in der Kynologie zu erhalten.

In 2018 wurden nach Beschluss der Außerordentlichen Generalversammlung der FCI Mission-, Vision- Statement und Werte der FCI wie folgt überarbeitet:

- f/ Die FCI anerkennt und respektiert Abkommen mit nationalen Hundeverbänden, die keine FCI-Mitglieder sind.

- h/ Die FCI sorgt für die regelmäßige Durchführung von Championaten auf Welt- und Sektionsebene.

Dear Readers,

Hopefully, the year 2022 seems to mean the very end of the awful pandemic that affected all of us, privately and professionally. Let's hope that the situation is now under control worldwide and our lives and activities can resume safely and happily.

Very sadly, we lost some prominent personalities of our dog world and I feel it my moral duty to pay a very specific tribute to them. Some of them played such an important role in my life and career at the FCI.



Dr. Kelemen Atilla-Béla-László sadly passed away on January 8, 2022. Dr Kelemen was the President of the Judges Committee of the Romanian Canine Association (A.Ch.R.) and its Honorary President.



Mr Ronald H. Menaker, passed away on Wednesday 16 February 2022. Among many prestigious mandates, which would be too numerous to list, Ron has been Chairman of our Cooperating Partner, AKC, for many years. He was AKC Chairman Emeritus. Ron was a close friend of the FCI.



Mr Rafael de Santiago sadly left us on 7 July 2022. Rafael has served the FCI General Committee for decades in various capacities such as Treasurer, Vice-President and President from 2013-2019. Rafael was a great man, who has dedicated his life and tirelessly served the world of Cynology and the FCI faithfully and with passion.



Mr Hans Müller also passed away on 8 September 2022. Besides his function as an FCI International Judge, as a Board member and President of the Swiss Kennel Club (SKG), Hans Müller was the FCI President from 1984 until 2013, and to date the only President of Honour of the FCI, a unique and well-deserved title. Hans was a charismatic person, with a true spirit of positive leadership, a real gentleman with impressive human approach.



Mr Andras Korozs, President of the Hungarian Kennel Club (MEOE Szövetség), passed away on Thursday November 10, 2022, after a short and serious illness. Andras was a most knowledgeable breeder and judge, not to mention one of the kindest and sincerest friends anyone could ask for.



Mr Dan Ericsson, one of the greatest, most sought after and knowledgeable dog people of our time died on 15 December 2022. He was a legendary breeder, judge and supporter of pedigree dogs. In case more persons passed away, without us being notified, I apologise if I have failed to mention them!

International CACIB shows

It is a true pleasure for me to be able to report very good figures, a bit closer to the results we used to have until 2020 when Covid-19 hit us.

Despite the prohibition for Russia to conduct FCI-CACIB shows on their territory, despite the tragedy affecting Ukraine which makes them unable to organise shows and despite the withdrawal of Bulgaria from the FCI membership (for a total loss of more than 200 shows), the number of FCI-CACIB shows has come back to a relative normality.

Major decisions made by the FCI General Committee and important facts

As you will read, the year 2022 was very rich in events and decisions. I have tried to give a summary so that the readers will be properly informed or remembered about the majority of them.

- The FCI General Committee accepted the request from the Bulgarian Republican Federation of Cynology to be removed from the FCI membership list from 1st January 2022.
- Our German and Austrian members (OKV and VDH) had to face severe anti-dog attacks and both are now in touch with their authorities to find the best possible solutions, in the interest of dogs and breeders.
- Our Norwegian member (NKK) was summoned to Court by the Norwegian Society for Animal Protection. The case is still ongoing.
- On April 27th, the FCI and the KC (Kennel Club) have signed a renewal of their agreement about mutual recognition of their judges. The document is available at <https://fci.be/en/Members-Partners-89.html>
- Two new FCI titles, International Beauty Champion-Junior and International Beauty Champion-Veteran, were introduced from 1st August 2022.
- Different sanctions were taken against our Russian (RKF) and Belorussian (BCU) members.
- The DKK very successfully hosted the FCI HD Conference in Copenhagen. More info about the results are available from the FCI Office, which circulated the report on the event, and from <https://fci.be/en/FCI-tackles-Hip-Dysplasia-HD-in-Copenhagen-on-May-24-25-2022-DK-3689.html>.
- Our FCI Committee for Dog Welfare and Health finalised different interesting booklets related to responsible dog ownership, to puppy caring, to the importance of buying dogs from registered breeders.

- The General Committee lifted all the measures related to Covid and the ordinary official show and international championship regulations are in force again since 1st January 2023.
- In March 2022, the FCI opened a bank account “**Solidarity with Ukraine**” meant at collecting funds to help Ukrainian breeders and their dogs, not only in Ukraine, but worldwide.
- The FCI and the World Cat Federation signed an agreement to improve, jointly, the welfare and health of our four-legged friends. FCI STANDARDS COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT



We had held our annual Standards Commission meeting at Milano, Italy on Saturday 14th, May 2022.-

The Standard Commission main work continues being to revise and adapt new and existing standards. The focus on dog's health continues to make countries review the text in standards extra carefully to avoid wordings that may result in interpretations that can lead to exaggerations that might cause health risks in the dogs, not forgetting to take special care to maintain the type of the breeds.

The Commission thoroughly revises and amends standards continuously and the co-operation with the National Organizations is usually efficient. Still, the procedure must go through several steps before a standard can be changed and published, these documents are the backbone in the work of the FCI and its member countries.

Viewing of the text in standards from a health and welfare perspective has been intensified. This is not always about the wish of the countries of origin but, in the interest of keeping the breeds for the future, we all have to

realise that exaggerations in type as well as character issues in dogs might not only affect the health of the dogs, but it may also increase the risk to have breeds banned by law in some countries.

We had marked a working method within the commission; how to manage the standards since they arrive to the office until they are seen and discussed by the commission, then send back to the Country of Origin for acceptance and then to General Committee for their approval to be latter published.

We do insist on asking to the National Organizations collaboration on having a representative good drawing or picture to illustrate the front page of the FCI Standards as this will help a lot the comprehension of the whole standard.

Next meeting was decided by members of both commissions, Standard and Scientific, to take place at Montevideo, Uruguay on May 2nd and 3rd 2023.

FCI AGILITY COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT

2022 began with hope. Most of the countries did not have the strict rules anymore because of the Covid pandemic.

So we were happy and looked forward to becoming more and more normal during the year, with personal meetings for the members of the FCI Agility Commission instead of just video conferences.

Special highlights were always our big international events:

♦ **Junior Open Agility World Championship**

15th – 17th of July in Vantaa – Finland

This event replaced the former Junior European Open. With this new event, the future of agility would have their own World Championship.

Within the FCI it is the only youth world championship in dog sports. We are very grateful that the FCI board approved this event as promotion of our sport to the youth.

♦ **The European Open Agility**

28th – 31st of July in Opglabeeek – Belgium

♦ **Agility World Championship Agility**

planned for years to be held in Russia

Until now, our dreams, for the year 2022 would have been wonderful.

But, at the end of February, when Russia started a war against Ukraine, we really didn't know what to do. Our World Championship which was to be held in Russia was in jeopardy.

For almost 5 years there had been plans to hold the World Championships in Russia at the request of the NCO RKF in Moscow. Not only that, but the international judges training was also to be held in St. Petersburg.

Because of the global pandemic, the AWC was postponed from one year to the next. And now, all of a sudden, Russia attacks Ukraine. In the FCI Commission, we quickly agreed that hardly any nation would send a team to Russia under these conditions. Therefore we

asked the FCI Board to withdraw Russia from the World Championships and the FCI Board reacted immediately and granted our request.

This meant that we would need a new host for our AWC. With only 6 months to prepare and find sponsors, we were very unsure if we would find one. To make a long story short, the OEKV, the Austrian Kennel Club was so kind to be the host and to support the AWC 2022 in Schwechat (we later learned, the Major of Schwechat was also a supporter).

The first major event was the **JOAWC** in Finland. This first JOAWC had only 281 participants from 20 countries (in comparison: the JEO had more than 450 participants). This was mainly due to the long journey to come to Finland for most of the European teams. Finland however, was an excellent host. The stadium (Hakunila Sports Park in Vantaa) was a perfect location for an agility competition on an athletics field (grass).

One of the competitors' girls, who reached the first ever title of World Youth-Champion said: "But even if we hadn't won anything... The best thing about the JOAWC is the atmosphere. This is the last time I'll be able to take part, because I'll be 18 this year, and I'm sure I won't miss anything as much as this feeling of joy and togetherness. It was like this every year at the JEO".

There was dancing to songs such as the Macarena and Hey Baby, and polonaises around the stadium in which all the nations were represented. The French, Finns, Estonians and Americans swaying in the campsite and shouting "We are the champions" at the top of their lungs. With this atmosphere you could literally see the forming of new friendships.

At these junior events it has always been a special atmosphere because these kids share a passion, and they don't make a distinction between countries of origin. They look at how friendly the child/junior is with the dog and what the team is doing in agility. They make friends all over the world and use all kinds of communication (or even just writing "old-fashioned" emails) for their connections that they keep over the years.

Two weeks later the world of agility visited Belgium to take part in the European Open, the biggest FCI Agility event of 2022.

The Sentower Park in Oglabek was able to welcome 722 participants from all over the world. It was a good venue and it was so well organized that all the handlers were truly enjoying this event.

The last big event of the year was the World Championships in Schwechat, just outside Vienna. As I said, it was an adventure, especially for the head of the organizing team, Katharina and Hans Fried. They were the first to arrive in the morning and the last to leave in the evening. Everything was so well prepared also considering the short time they had to prepare for this major event.

We can only thank the whole team for their excellent work. The venue was not as big as in the years before and because the spectators didn't have reserved seats in blocks per country, there were often more than a couple of nations sitting next to each other. We all agree that this did not detract from the atmosphere that always accompanies an Agility World Championship, but rather added to it. Beside Hans and Katharina Fried there was another one who did an excellent job: FCI-Supervisor, Peter Feer, which has the duty to oversee the complete event. This job does not start at the opening ceremony, but long before. It is about making sure that everything and everyone involved is doing it in such a way that this AWC is run according to the rules that all countries have agreed upon.

On Sunday we had a surprise. The FCI President, Dr Tamas Jakkel, wasn't just a guest at the awards ceremony, he was so enthusiastic about agility that he spent the whole day watching us, having many things explained to him and being more and more impressed by the positive atmosphere. He even stayed for the closing ceremony, where he talked to visitors and teams. Dr Tamas Jakkel took the opportunity to bid farewell to Christa Bremer, the long-standing President of the FCI Agility Commission, who will not be standing for re-election at the Commission meeting on the Monday after the World Championships.

On a personal note, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Christa Bremer, who has led this committee for 19 years (since 2003), and under her supervision we have seen, among other things, the growth and professionalization of Agility, the creation of the European Open and the Junior European Open (which became the JOAWC). Thank you, Christa!!

In addition to our sporting events, we had a lot of video meetings, not only with all the delegates, but also in special working groups where we reviewed the rules, the guidelines for the obstacles and the guidelines for the judges. Because we started with these items very early, we had the opportunity to inform the NCO Commission about the planned changes, so that the delegates could inform their National Commission, which was very helpful for the motion. We had a timetable and it worked very well, so the new rules will be valid and published from 2023.

One of the major changes of the rules is the introduction of a new height class: Intermediate (for dogs between 43 and 47,9 cm).

The Monday after the AWC we had a physical meeting with all the delegates, an important point on the agenda was the election of the Board. We knew long before that Mr. Wilfried Claes (BE) and Mr. Paolo Meroni (IT) would not be standing again because of their illness and Mr. Allen Hansen, the Danish delegate and also one of the Vice-Presidents, left the Commission. Also, as stated before, Mrs. Christa Bremer let us know that she would not be standing for president anymore.

The new board of the FCI Agility Commission was voted for and now consists of:

FCI COMMISSION FOR DOG DANCING – ACTIVITY REPORT

2022 was the year we have longed for during the pandemic – the year when we could finally meet again for international competitions and championships.

The commission had the first event already in January, when we were hosting an online FCI Judges Conference. About 70 judges from all over the world followed the 6 lectures, which were held over 2 days.

We had managed to find competent speakers, who were willing to teach free of charge so that we could offer the conference for free and reach as many international judges as possible.

The speakers were; Carmen Heritier from Germany, who was talking about Physiology of Dogs. Johanna Saariluoma from Finland, who was giving a thought provoking lecture on Managing Bias in Judging. Charlie Westrin from Sweden took the participating judges through the judging criteria “Content”. Corinne Medauer from France talked about the judging criteria “Presentation” and Susanne Ekblom from Finland talked about the judging criteria “Artistic Interpretation”. Emmy Marie Simonsen, was the hostess and did also talk about Animal Welfare in Dog Dancing.

It was a rewarding weekend and the lectures can still be found on the FCI website (<https://fci.be/es/Commission-de-Dog-Dancing-3588.html>) so that future judges can also benefit from them.

The World Championship 2022 was held at a beautiful venue, Le Tigre, in Margny-lès-Compiègne in France. Our French hosts had put a huge effort into organizing a fantastic event for us. Everything was thought of and worked flawlessly. A big and heartfelt thank you must go to Société Centrale Canine pour l'Amélioration des Races de Chiens en France for their thoughtful hospitality.

In November, Verband für das Deutsche Hundewesen hosted the first European Open Championship. It was held in Stuttgart, Germany. The regulations

for this championship were approved in 2020 and it was scheduled to be held for the first time in October 2021, but the corona virus made it impossible to go through with. It was a great joy to see it become a reality this year and the VDH did an excellent job with the organization. Thank you to everyone involved.

The European Open Championship (EOC) is open to all dogs with or without a pedigree and the commission wish to make it even more inclusive and highlight the many variations within our sport. Therefore, the regulations have been adapted slightly and in future the EOC will focus on several disciplines; groups and pairs, biathlon (teams that do both Heelwork To Music and Freestyle), junior handlers and of course the more traditional HTM and Freestyle classes.

One of the other things that the commission have worked on this year is a shared set of rules for dog dancing competitions from beginners to advanced level. The conclusion of this work was that it is too soon for a set of international rules covering all levels. At this point it is best for the development of the sport to have a shared set of rules for the championships and let each NCO help their dogs and handlers to reach championship level the way that suits the individual country best.

The commission has held 2 meetings this year. Both meetings were online meetings. One was held in May and one in October. Our next meeting will also be an online meeting and it will be held on June 2023.

I would like to use this opportunity to thank my colleagues in the Dog Dancing Commission for their open-minded and positive attitude towards the Commission's work. And also a big thank you to the FCI General Committee for their support of our sport and work.

FCI COMMISSION FLYBALL – ACTIVITY REPORT



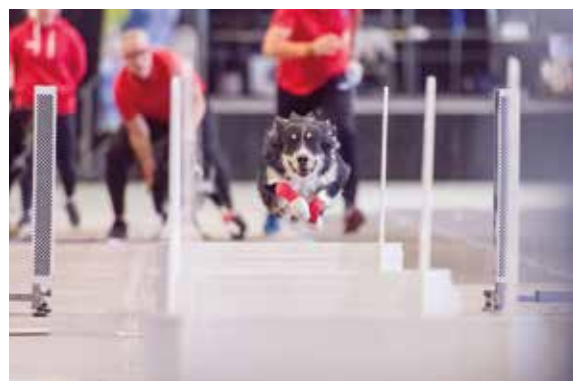

Since the establishment of its commission in 2014, the discipline of Flyball has gone through a steady rise and in many countries. We saw a clear increase in the number of participants and their level. Since the first World Cup in 2018 in France, we have also seen more interest out of the Anglo-Saxon countries which have been thought to be the cradle of flyball in living memory. The World Cup that should have taken place in Belgium in 2020 would have become a fantastic event, with the participation of several teams from the United States, Canada, The Russian Federation and South Africa. Every European top team would of course have been present as well so the competitions for selection were the main goals for teams in 2019. For well-known reasons it was not meant to be, and a few months ahead of schedule the FOWC 2020 had to be called off. Some of the teams lost the money for their flights and hotels, which caused financial hangovers, and during Corona, teams were no longer allowed to train because of the proximity rules in many countries causing a regression where even some teams ceased to exist.

Initially the organisation geared up for another attempt in 2021 but it quickly became clear that in that case the field of participants would be decimated.

It was then decided to allow the Flyball Open World Cup to be held in May 2022, and to wait and see who could or could not come. Unfortunately, not a single team from America, Canada nor South Africa managed to get teams ready in time for this event, and the Russian teams of course dropped out for known reasons. As a result, the attractiveness of the championship decreased in that the interest of some countries and sponsors was no longer what it had been in 2020. Fortunately, the British top teams were present which also motivated the best teams from Poland and the Czech

Republic to participate. So, on May 28 and 29, 2022, 64 flyball teams, including all European top teams, gathered in Lommel. It became a very attractive spectacle with flyball of the highest level, where all teams had to go to the extreme. Considering that the FOWC record since 2018 was on the American team Fur Fun with 15.44 and that at least ten different teams recorded faster times during this Championship says enough. In the final battle for the highest honour, it was eventually between the Polish "Fractal International Affair", the Belgian "Roadrunners Beep Beep" and the English teams "Tails We Win", "High Flyers" and "Aces High". After several fantastic races, the final victory went to the Belgian team Roadrunners Beep Beep, who also significantly sharpened the new FOWC record with a time of 14.62. The home base of the Roadrunners, who also won Crufts earlier that year, is Zonhoven, barely 30 km from Lommel. Later in the 2022 season, the same team set an incredibly fast new world-record when they ran 14.27 outside on a grass surface.

On the eve of the World Cup, the FCI Flyball Commission met to evaluate the past years and to discuss several rule changes. The main change on the menu was the introduction of wider jumps. In several countries, national regulations have been changed with jumps of 77cm (30") instead of 61cm (24"), which they believe is safer. This was already requested in 2020 and 2021, and after an evaluation period in the countries concerned, the committee decided to introduce this as a general FCI rule as of 2023.

I offer my deepest thanks to all who have contributed to this historical canine spectacle, especially the Belgian Canine Organisation KKUSH and the team from Flyballdogs vzw that were the official hosts for the organization of the Flyball Open World Cup in Belgium,

FCI SHOW COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT

My third annual report as president of the Show Commission – and another year to look back on.

Unfortunately, in 2022 we had to cancel our normal FCI Show and Show Judges Commission meeting, which should have been held in Riga – in cooperation with Latvijas Kinoloģiskā federācija.

Due to the accelerating pandemic worldwide at that time, the two committees first chose to postpone the meetings. We ended up holding a one-day meeting in connection with 2022 - Section Winner Show in Paris.

During the year, the FCI GC finalized our draft on the launch of the new FCI - Champion titles, for juniors and veterans respectively.

On 1 of August 2022, the new championships came into force, and afterwards with some changes (1 of January 2023) approved at the FCI GC meeting in November 2022.

Of course, the war between Russia & Ukraine has filled a lot in the past year. A situation that has affected the entire dog world, but not least the many dog owners in the war zones. This has meant lots of cancelled dog shows and restrictions for both judges, owners, handlers, and organizers.

Our world needs peace in the areas again soon, so our beloved dog world can once again return to a united dog world.

Highlights of 2022

The World Dog Show 2022 was organized by the Kennel Club of the Brazil (CBKC) in the middle of December in São Paulo. At the time of writing this activity report I miss the official number of participants.

Another World Dog Show (postponed from 2020) was organized by the Kennel Club of Spain in Madrid – at the end of June. The total number of dogs entered was **6.835**.



The section show in the America and the Caribbean Section 2022 was organized by the Kennel Club of El Salvador (Acansal) in the end of November in San Salvador. At the time of writing this activity report I miss the official number of participants.

The section show in the European Section 2022 was organized by the Kennel Club of France (Centrale Canine) in the end of April in Paris. The total number of dogs entered was **9.711** at the EDS.

The section show in the Asia, Africa and Oceania section 2022 was organized by the Kennel Club of Japan (JKC) in the beginning of April in Tokyo. The total number of dogs entered was **1.424**.

Right now, we can conclude that there was a number of CACIB shows that have been cancelled because of the pandemic/Corona crises in 2022, the situation in Ukraine/Russia – and in Bulgaria.

A total of **1024** CACIB shows were held, but unfortunately **455** CACIB shows were cancelled. **222** of the cancelled shows was not in Bulgaria, Russia or Ukraine – but not specific because of Covid.

The number distributed on the sections: Europe **731** CACIB shows completed and 183 cancelled, The Americas & Caribbean **130** CACIB shows completed and 14 cancelled. Asia, Africa & Oceania **163** CACIB shows completed and **25** cancelled.

Thanks to my colleagues in the Show Commission, Ms. Ekaterina Domogatskaya and Mr. Bojan Matakovic and my cooperating president from the Show Judges Commission, Mr. Adrian Landarte. My thanks go as well to the FCI office, to Mr. Yves De Clercq and his professional staff, and to our representative from the FCI General Committee, Ms. Barbara Müller.

Let us together look forward to 2023, with lots of activities and a world that returns to normal everyday life - with lots of great shows.

FCI HERDING DOGS COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT

Herding instinct is a complex of many characteristics and abilities which makes dogs of different breed useful to control flock animals. The main characteristics that dog breeds have in common are: interest in flock animals, willingness to cooperate with a handler, the drive to control the movement of the flock, the natural aim to search for a balance position to gain better control of the flock.

After almost 2 years of very poor period due to COVID-19 the herding activity restarted in all Countries with trials and tests. The collaboration among Countries and judge exchange was increased. An increasing demand applied from Countries to change same points of herding rules, mainly concerning on traditional style.

The Commission agreed on its online meeting on 20th November 2021 the members sending their proposals for adapting / correcting the rules for FCI herding. Than the following responsible persons check and distribute all proposals for adapting rules for our next online meeting:

- General Conditions: Lia Helmers-de Regt
- NHAT and HWT TS: Gábor Keve

- Trials TS: André Roller
- Trials CS: Daniela Rájová and Marina Nemchenko
- Guarding Dogs: Inna Baranova

On 31st January 2022 an online discussion helped the preparation work of proposals. But on our official online meeting on 27th March 2022 only two third of the proposals were finished. The participants (11 nations) decided to extend the preparation work till June 2022. As for helping of our activity two more online preparation were held. On 26th April 2022 ten representatives worked online on “FCI RULES FOR THE WORKING TEST FOR LIVESTOCK GUARDIAN DOG” document. Than on 17th May 2022 the representatives tried to finish our new FCI Livestock guarding dogs rule proposals. However the planned activity had not been finished new proposals arrived to modify other rules too. President Lia Helmers-de Regt drew the attention of those present (11 nations) to the fact that the rules can only be radically changed at fixed intervals, and suggested a reasonable timetable for amendments.

After all the painstaking preparatory work, the long overdue face-to-face commission meeting came on **9-10 July 2022, Dortmund, Germany.**

5. Herding situation in the various countries

At the online Meeting in November 2021 the Herding situation in the various countries had been discussed. Since that event the period is not finished, so the Herding situation of 2022 will be discussed at the next meeting in 2023 in Sweden. Because of that, we skipped this point.

6. Rules for GNAT and GWT (Guarding Dogs)

Several proposals were made by the various Commissioners and uniform solutions were found through the very good cooperation. The regulations have been revised and will be forwarded to the FCI

7. Revision General Conditions

The regulations have been revised and will be forwarded to the FCI

8. Revision Herding rules traditional style

The regulations have been revised and will be forwarded to the FCI.

As addition the Regulation of FCI NHAT, CIB and CITER rules have been revised and will be forwarded to the FCI

9. Election of President and Vice-President

Our President Lia Helmers and Luigi Cavalchini Vice President would like to step down as they would like to hand over to our youngsters. As our youngsters have not been on the committee for very long, so Lia and Luigi offered to be of assistance to the new President and Vice President, for that offer we are very thankful. Jouni Kautto (Finland) proposes not to vote in writing. However, Gabor Keve (Hungary) & Luigi Cavalchini (Italy), would prefer to vote in writing for various reasons. The whole Commission agrees with this. Blue slips of paper will be distributed.

Proposed by Luigi Cavalchini for the election of the president is Gabor Keve (Hungary). He is briefly introduced by Luigi.

Gábor Keve is elected **President** by 8 votes with 1 abstention

Proposed by our secretary for the election of the Vice President is Andre Roller (Germany). He is briefly introduced by the secretary. Orange slips of paper will be distributed for the vote.

Andre Roller is also elected **Vice-President** with 8 votes and abstention.

Sandra von Erlach confirmed that she will **remain secretary until Sweden 2023**

10. European Championship HEC Traditional Style

The 1st HEC will take place in Hortobágy Hungary from the 22nd – 24th September 2023

Gábor Keve (Hungary) asks the countries to ask their starters to prepare themselves. Two dogs per country plus a reserve are allowed to be entered, but only two dogs are allowed to participate. Expected are 7 to 8 countries participating. The national qualifications must be closed by the 30th of June 2023.

11. Next Meeting of the FCI Herding Dogs Commission 2023

The next Herding Dogs Commission meeting is expected to take place in Sweden on 1st July 2023.

12. Various

Johann Kurzbauer (Austria) suggests that the Kelpie should no longer run in the TS but with the Border Collies in the CS. We will discuss this topic in Sweden next year so that we can change it and it can be introduced in 2024.

Andre Roller reminded everybody that all the demo films of the Herding Commission on the FCI Website must be taken down instantly! It was fully agreed.

A **judge's seminar** is planned to be organized next year **12-14 May 2023 in May at Szaporca in Hungary**. Gábor Keve will provide further details as soon as possible.

At the end of the meeting, the President and all members would like to thank Andre Roller for the hospitality of the VDH and the good organization. The vice president wishes everyone a good journey home.

Followed by our meeting in Dortmund the above published minutes was sent to the FCI office in time by our secretary Sandra von Erlach. However the modified rules had not undergone language proofreading. The mandate of our elected Secretary, who was entrusted with this task, has been revoked by the sending country. This decision put the new management in a rather awkward situation, as we had to deal with the unexpected departure of an experienced board member.

Therefore, the submission of the revised regulations will be delayed until early 2023, which will hopefully be approved by the FCI GC in March 2023.

FCI OBEDIENCE COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT

We could start off year 2022 with positive expectations and it turned out to be a year without continuous cancellations. We could have our World Winner Championship competition as planned and meet face-to-face at our annual meeting, long overdue. One disappointment was, however, that we could not organize a judges' meeting even though we had the new rules for our obedience competitions valid from 1.1.2022.

A judges' meeting would have been appreciated, but we could not actualize this.

Annual meeting

The FCI Obedience Commission had its annual meeting in Olten, Switzerland on November 19th – 20th. Nowadays we are used to having some 20 delegates present, but this year only a dozen of our delegates could participate. The original plan was to have the meeting in connection with the WWCh-2022 in June but the meeting had to be postponed due to a wish from the Danish Kennel Club and, not all countries had appointed their delegates in the commission by June. Setting new dates quite suddenly is difficult as our delegates have many other dog sport related activities booked for weekends. Nevertheless, we had a good meeting and made plans for several future events.

Spain's delegate verified that we are welcome to Spain to compete for the 2023 World Winner Championships. Also, Latvia's delegate had positive expectations that their Kennel club will invite us to have our 2024 World Winner Championships in Latvia. This has also been verified later. The 2025 WWCh is still open, but we are looking hopefully towards Norway.

As we had not been able to have a judges' meeting, discussing the new rules for obedience competitions got lots of attention at our annual meeting. We discussed the pros and cons of the changes.

World Winner championship competition 2022

The World Winner competition 2022 in obedience was arranged in Århus, Denmark on the 23rd – 26th of June 2022. The competitors were to some extent unhappy due to not having received so high grades as usual. But it is also a fact that the new rules with some new exercises and practices were challenging and the dogs were not yet so secure in their performances. Probably also, the pauses due to covid, might still have had some influence on the performances.

The judges of the competition were: chief judge Mr Palle Bergsø from Denmark, Mrs Christine Nominé from France, Mrs Lone Thyrgaard from Denmark and Mr Ton Hoffmann from The Netherlands. The Nordic countries reclaimed the podium. Team Sweden won, team Norway was second and team Finland third.

Traditionally the President of the Obedience Commission gives a few special prizes to teams of her own choice, teams that have for some reason impressed her.

This time one special prize went to Whispering Oaks Arranck, a golden retriever from Austria and handler Nicole Besenbock. They had start number one, which is usually not so appreciated by the handlers. They did a nice set of exercises, but with a little bit of unfortune. The missed a place in the finals by 0.75 points. The two other special prizes went to the two Ukranian competitors: border collie Livin' La Vida Loca and handler Ekaterina Osetskaya and bordercollie Blackberry Grin Veli and handler Maryna Nemchenko.

FCI RALLY OBEDIENCE COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT

First of all let me introduce this kind of dog sports, which is maybe new to some one of you:

Rally Obedience (also known as „Rally“ or „Rally-O“) is a dog sport based on obedience. It was originally devised by Charles L. "Bud" Kramer from the obedience practice of "doodling" — doing a variety of interesting warmup and freestyle exercises. The doodles were usually parts of obedience exercises that taught the skills and improved performance and accuracy.

Unlike regular obedience, instead of waiting for the judge's or steward's orders, the competitors proceed around a course of designated stations with the dog in heel position. The course consists of 10 to 25 signs that instruct the team what to do. Unlike traditional obedience, handlers are allowed to encourage their dogs during the course.

In the past 15 years Rally obedience has become very popular in many of our countries. In my home country Austria, for example, the first official regulations had been set up in 2016 and since that the popularity has grown enormously, becoming the 3rd most popular official dog activity in my country.

Looking through the countries the variety of different national regulations set up shows an interesting mix of exercises: In some countries for example the possibility of changing the heelside (left- or righthandling) was determined, in others the mix of two or more signs (so called „More Signs Exercises“) has given a wider space for judges to create new courses.

Since professionalism had been grown and the call for international competitions was getting noisier the General Assembly of the FCI decided in 2017, to found an own Commission to care about an international regulation for this lovely sort of working together with our „best friend“.

To get an impression of our work that had been already done in the years 2018 to 2021, see the following video arranged by the media expert of our commission, Mrs. Solveig Zetterström (Norway):

In 2022 COVID-19-pandemic-restrictions had more or less ended in our countries and so it was possible



that we had two face to face meetings (Vienna in April 2022 and Helsinki in August 2022). Beside this we had two Online-Meetings (in February 2022 and in November 2022). At the meeting in Helsinki I was elected to the president of the commission, which I am really honoured about. Mrs Tytti Lintenhofer (Finland) as Vice-President and Paul Lysholdt (Denmark) as Secretary are supporting me in our work.

At the meetings in 2022 we fixed up the Exercise signs set with detailed descriptions, used in international regulations. A draft was had been sent out as a pre-information to the kennel clubs in early 2023. After that we worked on the general regulations, the judging guidelines and the preparations for the 1st FCI Rally Obedience World Winner in 2024.

We all in the Commission are looking forward to a very interesting year 2023 hoping to meet us again in face to face meetings in Solrod Strand, Denmark, in the end of March and in Hemer, Germany, in the middle of August. The next online meetings via Skype will be held in the end of January.

Our goal is to finish the rules so that they can be introduced by I.I.2024 in our countries. Afterwards we will care about international seminars for judges and the 1st FCI Rally Obedience World Winner in 2024 which I am convinced will be a great event.

FCI SHOW JUDGES COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT



The Société Centrale Canine was the host of our annual meeting. After two years complicated by the pandemic, thanks to France, we had the opportunity to hold our meetings, which on this occasion were followed by the European Section show and in a single day. On April 26th we had the meeting with 35 delegates present coming from 35 FCI full member countries, 15 guests and Mrs. Barbara Müller as FCI representative. After our meeting, we had a joint meeting together with the FCI Show J. Commission. The meetings were at Hyatt Regency Paris CDG, everything was very well set and organized perfectly; took place in a climate of friendship and camaraderie.

Here we present the headlines of some of the topics covered that were carefully discussed in our meeting. Those interested can read more information in the minutes of the meetings of the FCI Show Judges commission.

BREED BY BREED EDUCATION

We slowly continue to receive and post presentations from some breeds. There are currently about 30 breeds published on the FCI website. We hope that our organizations understand the importance of having a detailed presentation, video, or report, prepared by the breed's country of origin. We consider it very important and necessary to have as many breeds as possible, we invite all national organizations to join as soon as possible.

FACEBOOK PAGE. "FCI Judges"

The creation of a Facebook page for FCI Show Judges was unanimously approved. Only active judges listed at the FCI Judges' directory could be approved to join the page. It is intended to have a space to answer questions, share experiences, publish educational articles, etc. In 10 months, we have gotten more than 1500 members.



FCI WORLD JUDGES CONGRESS

On December 12, 2022, Brazil hosted the 3rd FCI World Congress of Judges; 162 judges from 47 countries participated. It was a full day of work, with the

dissertation of 7 speakers. A perfect organization that included simultaneous translation in English, Spanish and Portuguese



FLOOR, RAMP OR TABLE

A The idea of making an official FCI list was accepted, specifying which dogs should be judged on the table, ramp or on the ground. It would be published on the FCI website and sent to the countries to be informed to all judges and event organizers.

Several more points were discussed in the commission and can be read in the minutes of the meeting. We discussed about: “Appointments at non FCI events”, “ethical code for FCI judges about participation on social media”, criterion to award the qualification “Excellent”, “the importance of typical character, temperament, and instinct of every breed in the evaluation”, “instructions to judges of brachycephalic breeds” and “how to interpret some of the rules in the FCI regulations”.

Joint Meetings with our colleagues from the Show Commission

On this occasion, all the meetings were held in one day, so we did not have enough time for the joint meeting. Most of the points were postponed to 2023.

We discussed some points like:

Minimum age to handle a dog in ring. **A minor handling dogs in the show ring must be mentally and physically able to control them. If the judge or the ring staff see that this condition is not provided, they can stop the presentation by safety reasons.**

We set the dates and countries that will host our next meetings in 2023 Peru, 2024 Latvia and 2025 Italy



The day after the meeting, the SCC invited us to visit its headquarters and its magnificent library and museum, a treasure of world dog lovers.



We must highlight the work of the office and especially of Marjorie Grimmelprez, thoroughly controlling that the processes and regulations in the appointment of new judges are complied with.

We thank Yves De Clercq and his colleagues from the FCI Thuin office for the way in which our documents were at all times sent promptly and correctly translated to our members, our thanks also go to the General committee and its representative in our Commission Mrs. Barbara Müller who supported and defended our proposals.

FCI COMMISSION FOR RETRIEVERS – ACTIVITY REPORT

The FCI commission annual meeting took place in Hämeenlinna, Finland on 28th of October 2022, prior to the European Championship. Mr. Stefano Martinoli, the at that time current president of the commission, was not presented but notified the commission by phone at the start of the meeting that he no longer was the delegate for Italy. The commission regretted this decision and thanked Mr. Stefano Martinoli for his commitment during several years.

Pieter Vivijs (Belgium) was proposed as the new president and was elected unanimously. Mrs. Andrea Böszörmenyi (Hungary) was again proposed as Vice President and Mrs. Anja Moller as Secretary, both were re-elected unanimously as well.

The commission reviewed the new international field trial regulations after the first season and defined several points to work on during the following year. Some small improvements have to be made on the regulations and we will discuss the criteria to become an international field trial judge. Last but not least the commission makes a priority of preserving the future of our sport.

IWT 2022

The International Working Test 2022 was organized by the Austrian Retriever Club on 11th & 13th of June. No less than 50 teams from 15 different countries took part in the event.

This edition was judged by Mrs. Anja Moller (Germany), Mrs. Petra Buijs (Austria), Mr. Ton Buijs (Austria), Mr. Zsolt Böszörmenyi (Hungary), Mrs. Karin Thunander (Sweden) and Mr. Kurt Bechtsteiner (Austria) who all did a magnificent job under hard conditions considering the heat.

Abbot-sleig Niger, took the victory with 507 points, 25 points more than team Switzerland I who took the second place after a run off against Austria I who became third.

Only 13 dogs were taken to the second day after completing 4 retrievers on day one. The final retrieve that proved to be too challenging for the first 3 dogs that were tried, was delivered perfectly to hand by Crazylake Barrique Blue, a black Labrador bred, owned and handled by Hannes Wiesinger from Austria who was awarded 1st Excellent with CACT/CACIT and European Champion 2022.

FCI COMMISSION FOR SIGHTHOUND SPORT (CSS) ACTIVITY REPORT

2022 announced as a year of renewed enthusiasm and eagerness to organize and compete on international level in our beloved sighthound sports. The international CACIL sighthound sports calendar announced more than 60 international coursing competitions and our first World Championship Coursing ever at Kalajoki, Finland.

Yet 2022 was also a year of hardship. With the start of the war in Ukraine we saw that the vulnerable were hit the hardest. The consequences of this war were felt worldwide. The prices of our most basic needs went sky-high, and we experienced for the first time in a very long time again that peace is not obvious. The high prices for fuel and other basic needs made it more complicated for a lot of us to compete in international competitions far away from home.

The updated international regulations for racing hampered the organization of international racing events but on the other hand a lot of countries started evaluating and working on new national regulations. At the CSS meeting of 2022 the decision was taken to start with a new working group racing to adapt the racing regulations. Shortly after the summer 2022 this working group, composed of experts of all the racing countries started to work in a very constructive and open atmosphere. A lot of work lies ahead.

With a well-organized CSS World Winner Coursing event, a FCI World Championship Coursing 2022 and a lot of international coursing events the overall impression of 2022 can be called quite successful.

FCI Championships 2022

From May 26th till May 29th the Finnish Kennel Club and the Finnish Sighthound Association hosted and organized the FCI World Championship and CSS World Winner event Coursing on the beaches of Kalajoki.

This coursing championship was probably the most northern championship coursing ever organized. Despite the long distance to travel for many of the partic-

ipants, almost 450 of the finest coursing sighthounds were registered in the catalogue.

They came from 20 countries (19 countries who are member of the CSS and the United Kingdom). There were 3 challenging fields situated on the sand beach of Kalajoki.

It was a splendid and well-organised championship with beautiful and high-quality runs. I want to express my gratitude for making such a good championship on a very short notice. Results are available on the FCI website.

Meetings of the commission

The FCI Commission for Sighthound Sport has 2 major priorities:

- Allocation and supervision of the FCI World Championships and CSS World Winner events;
- Keeping the 'FCI Regulations for International Sighthound Races and Lure Coursing Events' and the 'FCI International Guidelines for Lure Coursing Judges' up to date.

Traditionally the meeting of our commission is held together with the FCI World Championship Coursing.

In our meeting of May 25th, 11 countries out of 24 were represented by their delegates, 10 countries were excused and only 1 was absent.

The CSS looks forward to the FCI World Championship and CSS World Winner event Coursing organized and held at Kristianstad, Sweden from the 26th of June until the 2nd of July 2023.

As mentioned, the CSS decided in its meeting to create a new working group to start with the work of creating or adapting the organisation of racing events within the framework of the current rulebook (equal treatment of dogs, breeds and owners, animal welfare and safety, no long-lasting or lifetime measurements of whippet/pli). The option for a height class system (valid for some or all breeds if organizers want to use

this) based on event measurements in addition to the already existing time and weight classes can be explored. The goal is to create challenging events so organizers and participants are interested.

The following working groups remain very active to do the necessary preparatory work for the annual CSS meetings:

- Working Group Guidelines for organizers of CSS World Winner events and FCI World Championships

- Working Group International guidelines for Lure Coursing Judges
- Working Group Racing
- Working Group Rulebook

The next meeting of the CSS will be held June 27th, 2023, at Kristianstad, Sweden

FCI UTILITY DOG COMMISSION – ACTIVITY REPORT

After the corona-related restrictions, the committee meetings could again be held in person in 2022. The first meeting took place on March 12th and 13th in Roudnice nad Labem, Czech Republic. For both meetings, the delegates also had the opportunity to participate digitally. This offer was very well received.

A working group was set up to deal with the revision of the examination regulations. Before presenting a final proposal, the commission will deal intensively with the goals of this sport, the current challenges and the requirement profiles of the working dog breeds. Defining goals in these areas is of enormous importance before the path to goal attainment is laid down in the form of examination regulations.

On the basis of the Commission's proposal, the FCI General Committee decided that in all FCI member countries the stick hit may no longer be used during defense exercises, and that the soft stick may only be used to threaten the dog.

149 dogs from 35 nations took part in the world championship for working dogs in Roudnice nad Labem from September 7th to 11th.

The world tracking dog championship was postponed to October 11-16 due to the clashes between Russia and Ukraine. 43 dogs from 25 participating nations were presented.

The 2nd session of the Working Dogs Commission took place on September 12, 2022 in Roudnice nad Labem, following the World Championship for Working Dogs. The election was held at this meeting. The long-standing FCI President Frans Jansen was presented with the award. A board consisting of 5 people was elected from the delegates. In addition to the President Robert Markschläger from Austria and the two Vice-Presidents Klaus-Jürgenglüh from Germany and Igor Lengvarsky from Slovakia, this board includes Clemente Grosso from Italy and Hari Arcon from Slovenia.

Work of the Commission

- At the online meetings and chat discussions the Commission was preparing the presentation (more later) and discussing several important topics. Members come from different parts of Europe and the World, where NCOs use different principles of propagation. The information & experience exchange was very inspirational and only thanks to mutual communication could the commission members start doing some parts differently in their own countries to promote cynology to the youth. - The Commission representatives have made recommendations to their NCOs to follow FCI Youth guidelines
- The Commission representatives have started deeper cooperation with other sectors of youth cynology in their countries.
- At the beginning of the year 2022 the Commission worked on its statement to the age of Junior handling representatives at the WDS 2020, held in Spain 2022. As all of us know, WDS in Madrid was postponed for 2 years. This was the reason, that also representatives over 20 years of age were participating in Madrid 2022. In our opinion, Junior handling is a children's competition and a 20-year-old young experienced man or woman can not be compared to the young, for example daily selected finalists. Com-

mission will work in 2023 on changing this part of the FCI YOUTH document.

- On February 16th, in the FCI Podcast: Inside the FCI, Mr. Gopi Krishnan hosted a representative of the FCI Youth Commission – Dominika Hradská, where Dominika introduced the aims, visions, and goals of the Commission.

- after research the Commission found out, there is no FCI Youth Championship in Hunting, because of the gun possession law in many countries, which is understandable. There are still competitions and educational events in several FCI NCOs for hunting thanks what there are more young people involved in purebreed dogs

- unfortunately, there is also no World nor European FCI IGP Youth Championship, but the FCI YOUTH commission set itself a goal – to try to change this situation and help with organizing of the biggest events of IGP for youth in the future

- even though there is a separate space for AGILITY in reports, the FCI YOUTH commission wants to inform you, there are regular **FCI Junior Open Agility World Championships**.

In 2022 Finland hosted the largest Agility event in Hakunila Sports Park and approximately 500 competitors during 4 days made of 500 runs! FCI Youth Commission is very pleased by the work of its colleagues in the FCI Agility Commission and hopes for future co-operation. All the world champions 2022 are to be found here:

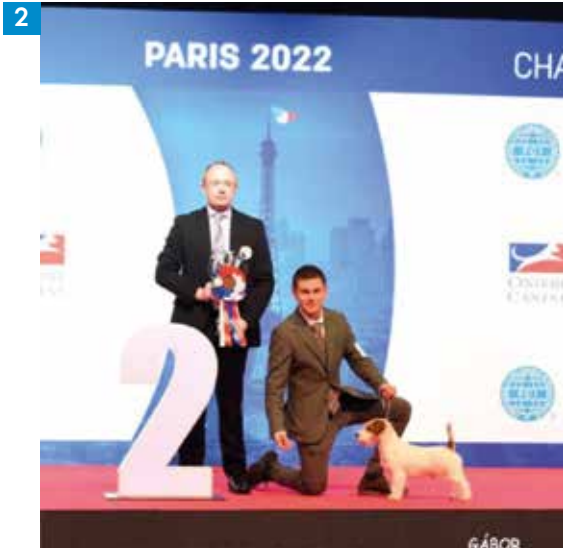

AUDIT REPORT

To the members of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale

In accordance with our engagement letter dated November 29, 2018, which set up scheduled audit of the accounts of your association, we submit the report of our mission.

The managing body is responsible for establishing financial statements, which provide an accurate image - according to the Belgian accounting regulations - as well as for organising the internal control which it considers necessary to issue financial statements exempt of material misstatements. It is our responsibility to express an opinion about these financial statements, based on our audit.

We audited the association's accounts for the fiscal year ending on 31/12/2022. This audit, drawn up based on the fundamental accounting principles issued by the Institut des Experts-Comptables & Conseils Fiscaux (ITAA), includes all the samplings and checking procedures we considered appropriate in view of the circumstances. These professional standards request our inspection to be organised and carried out under the form of a review allowing to achieve reasonable assurance that the accounts do not include any significant inaccuracies on the basis of the Belgian legal and regulatory dispositions on the subject. On this framework, we collected evidence regarding the information and the amounts provided in the financial statements which we consider sufficient and appropriate to base our opinion. In addition, the persons in charge within your association, and especially the accountancy department, provided us with all the necessary explanations and documents, making our mission easy to complete.

Here are our conclusions:

In the framework of our examination, we could state that:

- The administrative organisation and the internal control are suitable for the size and scope of the association's activities.
- Without prejudice to certain formal aspects of minor importance, the accountancy is in compliance with the Belgian legal and regulatory dispositions regarding the non-profit organisations, international non-profit organisations and foundations.

In addition, neither did we detect, nor were we made aware of any operation concluded or decisions made in breach of the correspondent statutes or legislation.

We were not made aware of any event occurring after our controls, which would be likely to significantly impact the accounts and thus modify the present conclusions.

At the conclusion of our audit of the accounts, and in compliance with the above-mentioned standards, we acquired reasonable assurance that the accounting report ending on December 31st, 2022, whose total balance amounts to **5 335 880,13 €** and whose income statement ends in a benefit of **32 946,33 €**, provides an accurate image of the assets, of the financial situation and of the association's result, according to the Belgian legal accountancy framework.

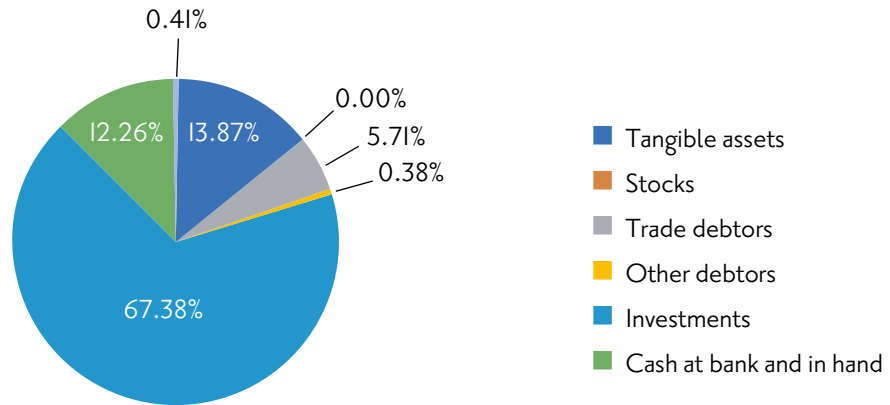

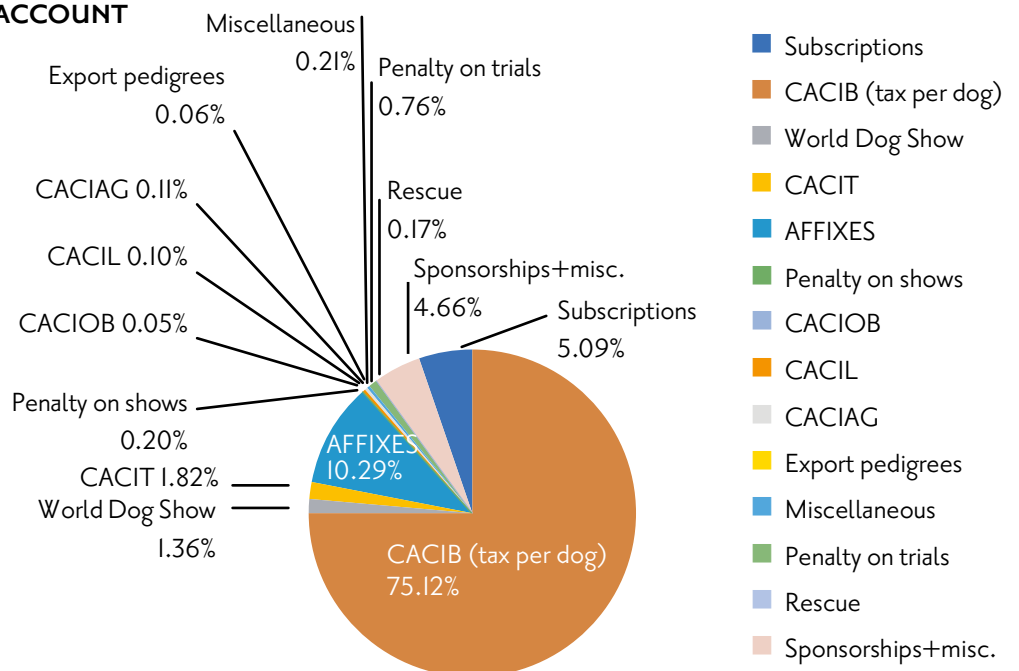

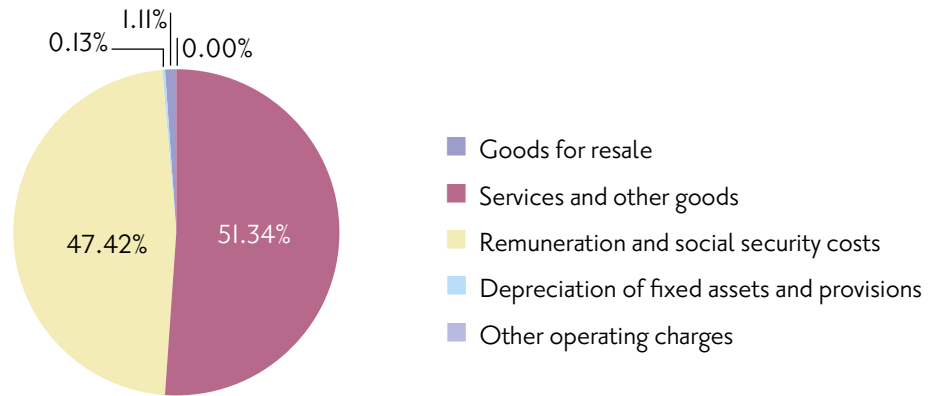

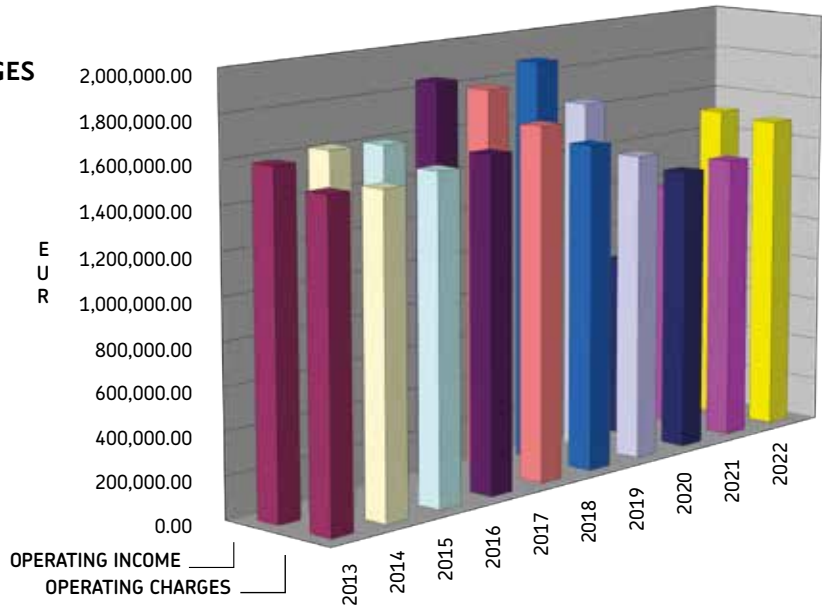

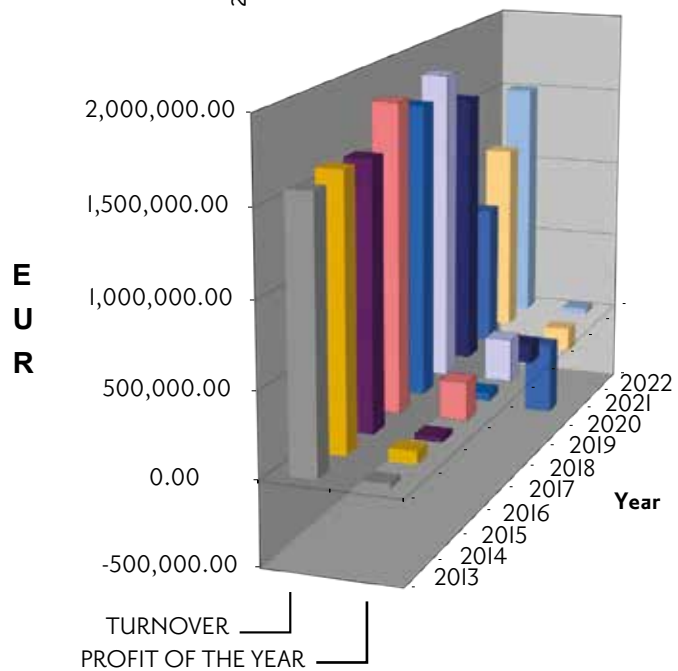

Letter of Understanding between FCI and AKC

WHEREAS the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) and The American Kennel Club (AKC) share the common goals of promoting and protecting purebred dogs ; and

WHEREAS the parties hereto have in the past cooperated to a certain extent in carrying out this object and have been acting pursuant to certain informal agreements made from time to time for that purpose ; and

WHEREAS it is agreed that the relations between AKC and FCI and its member registries should be explicitly written with a view towards future cooperation ;

NOW, this letter of understanding encompasses the mutually agreed to basis for the relationship between the parties as follows :

1. AKC will recognize the pedigree for any FCI registry that meets AKC requirements and that wishes to have such recognition.
2. AKC will not automatically give exclusive recognition to the FCI registry in any country in which there are multiple registries and FCI will not automatically give exclusive recognition to AKC's registry in the United States.
3. AKC will not register any dog born in an FCI member country until that dog has been registered in the Stud Book of the FCI registry or the AKC-recognised registry in that country. No dog born in the USA, belonging to breeds recognised by the AKC, will be registered by an FCI member registry unless the dog has been registered in the FCI-recognised registry in the United States. It is up to the FCI to decide about the registration of dogs born in the USA belonging to breeds not recognised by the AKC.
4. Each of the parties agree that when any information comes to its knowledge which might reasonably affect or be useful to the other party (AKC judges suspension, amended standards, etc.), it will immediately communicate such information to the other party.
5. FCI and AKC will deal with the judging approval reciprocity in a separate document (see attachment).

6. AKC will not sponsor any event in the country of an FCI member without the express permission of FCI and the FCI member. FCI will not sponsor any event within the territory of the United States without the express permission of AKC. Puerto Rico is exempted from this provision as both AKC and FCI have been previously sponsoring activities on that island.
7. While not an FCI member, FCI has graciously agreed to permit AKC to participate in its World or Section Agility, Utility, Obedience, etc. Championship Event provided that this participation does not prevent representative teams of FCI member organisations from taking part. If the AKC teams win the competition, they are not eligible for the title of FCI Winner at these events.
8. AKC registered dogs are eligible for the title of FCI International Champion under specific conditions to be agreed upon by the AKC and FCI.
9. Except with the agreement of the AKC, the FCI will not register kennel names for breeders living in USA (with exception of Puerto Rico) and, except with the agreement of the FCI, the AKC will not register kennel names for breeders living in countries where the FCI has a member, which the AKC has accepted.
10. FCI agrees to send to the AKC headquarters all revised breed standards and AKC agrees to send to the FCI headquarters copies of its Complete Dog Book, which includes all AKC standards, each time that such publication is revised.
11. The terms of this letter of understanding is agreed to by the parties listed below. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon reasonable notification to the other party.

Breed Judging

At FCI CACIB international shows, the AKC judges are eligible to judge and award the CACIB provided that the two following conditions are fulfilled:

1. the breeds they are scheduled to judge are recognised by the AKC (this does not include FSS and Miscellaneous classes).
2. the judges in question are allowed to judge, under AKC regulations, the breeds in question at AKC events and award them championship points. An AKC judge, residing in the United States, may not be approved as an FCI judge (breed, group, all breed) eligible to award CACIB.

At AKC events, the FCI judges are eligible to judge and award championship points provided that the following conditions are fulfilled:

1. the breeds they are scheduled to judge are recognised by the FCI and by the national kennel club, in their country of residence, which has jurisdiction over the judges in question
2. the judges are members of their national kennel club, in their country of residence, which is an FCI member or contract partner
3. the judges in question are allowed to judge, under FCI regulations, the breeds in question at FCI International CACIB shows and award them the CACIB

Group and BIS Judging

It is up to both, the AKC and the FCI members, to choose to invite or not a judge to judge a particular group (according to FCI or AKC breed nomenclature) at an AKC event or at an international FCI CACIB show taking into consideration the experience of the judge, his judging credentials and the breeds and their numbers in the groups to judge.

Letter of Understanding between the Fédération Cynologique Internationale and the Kennel Club

WHEREAS the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) and the Kennel Club (KC) share the common goals of promoting and protecting, in the case of the FCI, pedigree dogs and in the case of the Kennel Club, all dogs; and

WHEREAS the parties hereto have in the past cooperated to a certain extent in carrying out this object and have been acting pursuant to certain informal agreements made from time to time for that purpose; and

WHEREAS it is agreed that the relations between KC and FCI and its member registries should be explicitly written with a view towards future cooperation;

NOW, this letter of understanding encompasses the mutually agreed basis for the relationship between the parties as follows:

1. The KC, where it recognises the breed in question, will recognise the pedigree of any FCI registry that meets KC requirements and that wishes to have such recognition.
2. In so far as it is lawful, the KC will give exclusive recognition to the FCI registry in any country in which there are multiple registries provided that these registries meet KC requirements and the FCI will give exclusive recognition to the KC's registry in the United Kingdom. For the time being this will not include Malta and China.
3. The KC will not register any dog, or issue a pedigree to any dog, born in an FCI member country whose registry the KC recognises, until that dog has been registered in the FCI registry in that country. No dog born in the UK will be registered, or have a pedigree issued, by an FCI member registry unless the dog has been registered by the KC in the United Kingdom.
4. Each of the parties agree that when any information comes to its knowledge which might reasonably affect or be useful to the other party (KC or FCI judges suspension, amended standards, etc.), it will immediately communicate such information to the other party.
5. The FCI and the KC will endeavour to agree on the conditions to make their respective judges eligible to officiate at events sanctioned by them (FCI and KC).
6. The KC will not sponsor or support any event for dogs in the country of a current FCI member without the express permission of the FCI member. The FCI will not sponsor or support any event for dogs within the territory of the United Kingdom without the express permission of the KC. For the time being this will not include Malta and China.

7. While the KC is not an FCI member, the FCI has graciously agreed to permit the KC to participate in its World or Section Agility, Utility, Obedience, etc. Championship Event provided that this participation does not prevent representative teams of FCI member organisations from taking part. The KC teams may win the competition but are not eligible for the title of FCI Winner at these events.
8. The FCI agrees to send to the KC headquarters all revised breed standards and the KC agrees to send to the FCI headquarters copies of all revised breed standards. The FCI and KC will discuss health issues connected with breed standards on a regular basis.
9. FCI members are allowed to refer to the title of UK Champion by using the abbreviation "UK Ch + name of the dog".
10. Except with the agreement of the KC, the FCI will not register kennel names of breeders living in the UK and, except with the agreement of the FCI, the KC will not register kennel names of breeders living in countries where the FCI has a member, which the KC has accepted.
11. The terms of this letter of understanding are agreed to by the parties listed below. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon reasonable notification to the other party.

AGREEMENT ON THE MUTUAL RECOGNITION OF DOG SHOW JUDGES BETWEEN THE KENNEL CLUB AND THE FEDÉRATION CYNOLOGIQUE INTERNATIONALE

This agreement refers only to the mutual recognition of judges, hereinafter referred to as 'FCI Judges' who are resident in a FCI member country and are listed as designated 'International Judges' in the 'Judges Directory' published by the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI), to award Challenge Certificates and to judge Groups and Best in Show at Kennel Club (KC) licensed Championship Shows and for UK resident judges who are approved to award Challenge Certificates and Groups and Best in Show as published on the Kennel Club's Find a Judge² website to award Certificats d'Aptitude au Championnat International de Beauté (CACIBs) and to judge Groups and Best in Show at International FCI CACIB Shows held under the auspices of the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI).

It is intended that this agreement exists to recognise the mutual respect of both FCI and Kennel Club for judges and their training and education while upholding the highest standards of judging.

Furthermore, all other recognised canine activities such as Competitive Obedience, Agility, Field Trials, Working Trials etc. are specifically excluded.

1. This agreement will commence on the 1st day of May in 2022 and will be binding on both parties, subject to the right of termination by one or other of the parties giving no less than six months' notice prior to such termination.
2. Subject to six months' notice this agreement may be amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties concerned.
3. **This agreement is predicated on the basis that the Kennel Club (KC) and Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) have agreed to recognise and respect the knowledge and experience of their approved judges of their respective schemes for the approval, education and training of dog show judges.**

Approval to award Kennel Club Challenge Certificates (CCs)

4. The Kennel Club will accept nominations for approval, in accordance with Kennel Club Rules and Regulations and appropriate Codes of Best Practice as published and amended from time to time, to award Challenge Certificates to a breed(s) for the first time, without requesting completion of a Kennel Club Questionnaire, for FCI Judges resident in an FCI member country, providing they are suitably experienced, having previously awarded CACIBs to the relevant breed(s) in at least three different countries for a minimum period of 5 years prior to their first UK appointment for the breed(s).

5. FCI Judges resident in an FCI member country who were previously approved to award Challenge Certificates at Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows prior to the signing of this agreement will continue to be considered for approval for subsequent appointments subject to the proviso that they remain in good standing.
6. All nominations to judge at KC licensed shows will continue to be subject to the approval of the Kennel Club's Board.

Approval to award Fédération Cynologique Internationale Certificat d'Aptitude au Championn at International de Beauté (CACIBs)

7. UK resident judges who remain in good standing and are listed as having been approved to award Challenge Certificates for the relevant breeds on the Kennel Club Find a Judge website will be eligible to award CACIBs to these breeds.

Approval to judge Groups at International FCI CACIB Shows and Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows

8. FCI Judges resident in an FCI member country who were previously approved to judge Groups at Kennel Club licensed Championship Shows prior to the signing of this agreement will continue to be considered for subsequent appointments subject to the proviso that they remain in good standing.
9. UK resident judges who were previously approved to judge Groups at International FCI CACIB Shows, prior to the signing of this agreement will continue to be recognised as approved to judge the relevant Group(s) subject to the proviso that they remain in good standing.
10. The FCI and KC recognise and respect each other's approval criteria and agree to the mutual recognition of all those approved to judge Groups at International FCI CACIB Shows and at KC licensed Championship Shows. Those judges listed on the FCI Judges Directory and KC Find a Judge are eligible to accept an invitation to judge at this level, subject to the approval of the national kennel club.

Those judges listed on the FCI Judges Directory and KC Find a Judge are eligible to accept an invitation to judge at this level, subject to the approval of the national kennel club.

Memorandum of Understanding between FCI and CKC

WHEREAS the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (FCI) and The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) share the common goals of promoting and protecting purebred dogs;

WHEREAS the CKC and the FCI have, in the past, cooperated to a certain extent in carrying out these goals and have been acting pursuant to certain informal agreements made from time to time for that purpose;

WHEREAS it is recognized that both the FCI and the CKC are required to operate within the limits of the legislation governing their activities, including their respective constitution and by-laws;

NOW this letter of understanding expresses a mutually agreed to basis for the relationship between the CKC and the FCI as follows:

1. The CKC acknowledges the role of the FCI and its governing institutions as set out in the FCI Statutes as the primary world federation of dog registries.
2. The FCI acknowledges the CKC as the primary kennel club in Canada.
3. The CKC and the FCI agree that when any information comes to the knowledge of one party, which might reasonably affect or be useful to the other party (judges suspension, amended standards etc.), it will immediately communicate, in writing, such information to the other party.
4. The parties will meet at the request of either of them, within a reasonable timeframe and on basis of a consistent mutually agreed agenda which will include matters of common interest.

5. The FCI agrees to send to the CKC head office a copy of all breed standards with revisions as they occur and CKC agrees to send to the FCI headquarters all CKC breed standards with revision as they occur. The FCI and CKC will also share information concerning the decisions of their respective governing bodies such as the exchange of official publications.
6. The CKC will periodically provide the FCI with a list of the registries from the FCI member countries with which the CKC has reached an agreement providing for the mutual recognition of studbooks and pedigrees. The CKC will get in touch with all the FCI members and contract partners and inform them about the procedure to follow to gain CKC recognition. The FCI will notify the CKC of the accession of any country to FCI membership.
7. The details of a mutual recognition of FCI and CKC judges are written on a document which is part of this contract.
8. The FCI will not sponsor or sanction any event within Canada without the express permission of the CKC.
9. The CKC will not sponsor or sanction any event in an FCI member country without the express permission of the FCI and the agreement of the member country.
10. While not an FCI member, FCI graciously agrees to permit CKC to participate in its World or Section Agility, Utility, and Obedience Championship Events and any forthcoming canine performance event that may be mutually recognized by both organizations.
11. As long as no agreement is reached with regard to the working breeds (according to the FCI nomenclature) between the FCI and CKC, these breeds (CKC-registered dogs) are not eligible for the title of "International Beauty Champion". The non-working breeds (CKC-registered dogs) are eligible for this title provided that they comply with the FCI International Championship Regulations, i.e. 4 CACIB in 3 countries under 3 different FCI judges.
12. The CKC registered dogs are eligible for the other FCI international titles provided that they meet with the FCI requirements.
13. The FCI international directory of kennel names (affixes) is not open to CKC breeders and the FCI cannot guarantee that a CKC kennel name (affix) will not be similar to an FCI registered kennel name (affix) and conversely.

14. Both parties agree that the present Letter of Understanding shall not be interpreted or applied so as to require either party to act in a manner not authorized by or contrary to applicable legislation, including each party's constitution, rules or by-laws.
15. The terms of this Letter of Understanding are agreed to by both parties. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon giving the other party 60 days notice in writing.

CKC Judges eligibility to officiate at FCI International Events

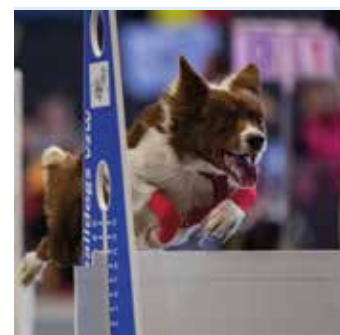
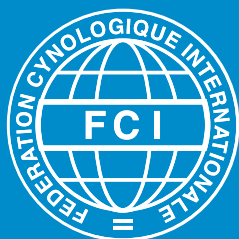
From April 1st, 2009, the following dispositions will apply:

- a) CKC judges are allowed to judge in the FCI member countries all-breed, group and specialty national shows, the breeds they are approved to judge in Canada.
- b) CKC judges who have already judged international FCI CACIB shows before December 31st, 2007, are allowed to award CACIB at international FCI CACIB shows, FCI World and Sections shows, to the breeds they are approved to judge in Canada.
- c) Once a CKC judge has judged four (4) national shows in four (4) different FCI member countries by the FCI breed standards, he/she is allowed to award CACIB to the breeds he/she is approved to judge in Canada.

It will be the responsibility of the FCI Office and of the judges concerned to keep track of assignments undertaken in an FCI member country. Taking into account the legal restrictions on the exercise of extra-territorial jurisdiction by the CKC, it will be the responsibility of the CKC to communicate them to their judges and the practical implementation and enforcement of the agreed above principles will be under the responsibility of the FCI Office, of the FCI members and the judges concerned.
